8 SYNOPSIS: Under existing law, the Alabama Peace
9 Officers' Standards and Training Commission
10 consists of certain members appointed by various
11 entities and the Governor.

12 This bill would change the membership on the
13 commission with one member appointed by the Police
14 Benevolent Association.

16 A BILL
17 TO BE ENTITLED
18 AN ACT

20 To amend Section 36-21-41, Code of Alabama 1975,
21 relating to the Alabama Peace Officers' Standards and Training
22 Commission, to change the membership on the commission with
23 one member appointed by the Police Benevolent Association.

24 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

25 Section 1. Section 36-21-41, Code of Alabama 1975,
26 is amended to read as follows:

27 "§36-21-41.

1 "The Alabama Peace Officers' Standards and Training
2 Commission is hereby created. The commission shall consist of
3 seven members, each of whom must be a qualified elector of the
4 state who is over the age of 19 years. The state fraternal
5 order of police shall designate one member of the commission
6 to serve for a term of four years; the Alabama Peace Officers'
7 Association shall designate one member to serve for a term of
8 four years; the Law Enforcement Planning Association shall
9 designate one member to serve for a term of four years; the
10 Division President of the Police Benevolent Association shall
11 designate one member to serve for a term of four years; and
12 the Governor shall designate ~~four~~ three members of the
13 commission. The members appointed by the Governor shall each
14 serve for terms of four years; provided, that the members
15 first appointed by the Governor shall serve for terms of ~~one,~~
16 two, three and four years, respectively, as the Governor shall
17 designate. The members may adopt bylaws to govern the
18 organization of the commission, its meetings and activities;
19 provided, that the bylaws shall not conflict with this
20 article."

21 Section 2. This act shall become effective
22 immediately following its passage and approval by the
23 Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
